

Sasamat Outdoor Centre Alcohol Policies

Sasamat Outdoor Centre is located within a Regional Park. As a consequence, the same attractive environment that makes the centre desirable for special events requires certain conditions be met before user groups can serve or consume alcoholic beverages during their rental period.

Sasamat Outdoor Centre reserves the right to terminate any rental agreement without further notice or refund in the event of a rental group failing to comply with these conditions.

1. All liquor service will be under the strict control of a designated representative of the rental party. No BYOB (Bring your own bottle) events are permitted. This representative must be sober and available at all times.
2. A Special Occasion License must be obtained from the B.C. Liquor distribution Branch (available from the Port Moody store) and the conditions of the permit must be enforced.
 - In the case of private family events (ie. weddings or family reunions - where the host supplies the liquor at no charge) this permit requires about 7 days to obtain.
 - For organization/agency events (ie company picnics) this permit requires 7 days to process and requires the approval of the Port Moody Police Department. The Police approval carries strict restrictions on conditions of the service and requires your representative to have a "Serving it Right" certificate.
3. Alcohol may only be consumed in the buildings/rooms approved by Sasamat Outdoor Centre and specified in the Special Occasion License. (Don't even bother asking for a permit for the waterfront or beach areas).
4. A Sasamat Outdoor Centre site attendant will be on the premises, at the rental group's expense, during the entire time liquor is being served. This attendant will bring concerns to the rental group's representative for action. If concerns or violations of the conditions of rental or the Special Occasion License are not resolved immediately this attendant is authorized to terminate the rental agreement.
5. Rental groups are responsible for all clean-up and facility repairs required as a result of their event.
6. The age of majority in B.C. is 19 years. Rental groups must follow the conditions of their Special Occasion License with regard to minors.
