Job Purpose

The roll of our leadership instructors is to facilitate and lead the Leadership Two Training Program for youth in grades 11 and up. The program builds on the soft skill development of past leadership and program skills / experience.

The Leadership Two program focuses more intentionally on the hard skill development of canoeing, winter camping and tripping / camping, outdoor skills, and hands on leadership skills with other people. The program itself has a pre-established curriculum, resource book, and supplies. The primary role of the instructors is to deliver the content in a fun and engaging way for the students.

During our off-season months from January to May Sasamat Outdoor Centre runs and hosts two levels of leadership programs for high school students that focus on the developing leadership principles and the experiential application of leadership and wilderness skills. Our goal is to develop competent leaders and community members that may use their experience as a strong foundation for future endeavors in life. Our Leadership Two classes take place from 7:00pm – 9:00 pm on Mondays at Douglas College (Coquitlam Campus) apart from weeks following weekend events. Duties and Responsibilities

Evening Theory Group Leadership

- Proactively prepare evening theory sessions and gather necessary teaching materials in advance of weekly meetings with co-leader.
- Collaborate or assign lesson facilitation to Co-Instructor prior to each evening theory session.
- Lead the evening theory sessions and facilitate the soft skill development of each participant in a professional and engaging manner with co-leader.
- Assist participants in attaining and scheduling volunteer hours.
- Prepare a final wrap-up session and special recognition event for group and submit a
 detailed account and field trip form to the Leadership Coordinator prior to event.

Standard Weekend Leadership (Wkd #1, #2, #3 & #4)

- Help coordinate transportation of participants to and from community center to Sasamat Outdoor Centre.
- Provide day and overnight leadership, program facilitation and participant support during designated weekend programming.
- Lead weekend workshops, programming and skill development during appropriate weekends.
- When not leading session participate in program alongside youth participants and support other staff in teaching sessions.
- Provide constructive feedback on weekend programs in a timely manner to Director of Community Program or leadership coordinator.

Camping Weekend Leadership

- Coordinate the packing/unpacking of camping gear and equipment from Sasamat
 Outdoor Centre in advance of trips and facilitate the packing/unpacking of personal gear
 and equipment from the participants; loaning appropriate gear from Sasamat Outdoor
 Centre to participants at your discretion.
- Inspect all equipment and gear (both from Sasamat Outdoor Centre and Participants) for defects before/after trip begins. Any defective equipment should not be used.
- Coordinate the transportation of participant to and from community center to camping locale.
- Provide 24-hour prudent leadership and support during camping trips.
- Ensure provincial camping standards and Sasamat's mission are upheld at all times during camping trips.
- Encourage self-reliance and participants to rely on their own abilities.
- Acquaint participants with the dangers and risks of the trip before it begins.

- Promote participation in accordance to individual abilities and do not encourage participants to run the risk of activities that are above their abilities.
- Ensure you are familiar with emergency procedure protocol and the operation of communication devices (S.P.O.T. unit & Satellite Phone)

Other Duties

The Leadership Two Instructor may be asked to assist in duties not listed above.
 Sasamat Outdoor Centre expects the support of all staff members fulfilling objectives that may not be specific to this position.

Hours

Evening Theory Sessions (Hourly Wage: \$18.63 / hour)

- 1 hour of planning and administration a week a week with co-instructor
- 2 hour of evening theory facilitation a week
- TOTAL = 3 hours a week

Weekend Sessions (Daily Wage: \$149.04 / day)

- Day rate (8 hours/day) for Friday, Saturday & Sunday 24hr supervision & commitment
- TOTAL = 24 hours a weekend
- *Breaks are included and worked into the schedule
- *Friday is still paid out as an 8-hour day regardless of start time time (standard start times are around 6/7 pm)
